ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- **Degree or level required**

Research Master degree (Master 2) awarded by a French university.
For the students who do not have a Research Master (2) degree from a French university, a dispensation request must be addressed to the UPMF through the Legal Sciences Doctoral program. The application form is available upon request to the following address: pascale.bertha@upmf-grenoble.fr

In all cases, a research subject must be established and a thesis advisor designated prior to registration. The Doctoral program can actively help with this process by asking the candidate to submit a Curriculum Vitae and a two-pages research project. The program will then orient the candidate towards best-suited Research Centre

- **Languages proficiency**

Fluent French required. This ability is evaluated by the thesis advisor.

- **Admission procedure**

Foreign candidates follow the same procedure as French students.
Candidates who don't have a French Master degree should know that the dispense request must be submitted before December 1st of the same academic year within which they would like to register.
